

As part of the broadcast spectrum incentive auction, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has authorized the repacking of the television band by assigning stations to new channels. WLAE was a part of this mandate and on October 19, 2019 at 1:00am, WLAE president, Ron Yager, flipped the switch for the new channel 23 frequency. This conversion project took over two years to complete and resulted in WLAE receiving a new and more powerful broadcast antenna and transmitter to better serve the viewers in Southeast Louisiana.



WLAE-TV premiered its newest documentary ***Holy Bowler – The John Blancher Story*** on Sunday, October 13.

Holy Bowler tells the story of how one New Orleans man’s faith restored his family and created an iconic cultural/music institution known around the world.

John Blancher had a dream – to play ball in the majors. A boyhood spent on fields of dreams won him the last baseball scholarship ever awarded by Loyola University in his hometown of New Orleans. But fate had other ideas including a wife, children and a very different kind of ball.



In March of 2019, WLAE partnered with the Historic New Orleans Collection and the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra to live stream and later broadcast "**Direct From New Orleans**," a classical musical concert staged and performed at St. Louis Cathedral. Leading up to the concert, video promo spots were placed on-air and on social media to engage audiences to watch online. During the live stream of the concert, the program received over 5,100 organic views with two-way interaction with the online audience. WLAE edited and enhanced the program for the television premiere in May with added interviews and contextual graphics.
