

Affordable Housing Matters

On August 29, 2021, Hurricane Ida, one of the most powerful and rapidly intensifying storms to hit the United States, delivered days of misery and destruction from the time it made landfall in Louisiana on the 16th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina.

Ida was an extremely dangerous Category 4 storm with sustained winds clocked at 150 mph. In the city of New Orleans winds in excess of 100 mph did catastrophic damage to property and the electrical power grid.

Many of the hardest hit by the storm were those living in low-income housing units. WLAE addressed the needs of the community with several episodes of the *Affordable Housing Matters* show delivering guidance and resources from local agencies and the Federal Emergency Management Association (FEMA).

Coping During The Covid Crisis

As the COVID-19 pandemic entered its second year, WLAE continued producing the weekly program *Coping During The Covid Cirsis*. In partnership with the University of Holy Cross, the goal of the show has been to provide mass therapy for a range of emotional issues people have during the pandemic — from anxiety to concerns over socializing again.

Each episode welcomes a variety of guests from the mental health field to offer insight and resources available to help viewers cope with the many stresses caused by the pandemic.

Last fall, the mental health program was recognized as New Orleans' Best TV Talk Show by the Press Club of New Orleans. To date, the station has produced 70 episodes and has expanded the reach to streaming on social media and statewide airings

on Louisiana Public Broadcasting.

Irma Thomas: The Soul Queen of New Orleans

In November of 2021, WLAE premiered the long-awaited documentary film, *Irma Thomas: The Soul Queen of New Orleans.* The program featured a candid interview with one of New Orleans' most celebrated musical icons as well as never before seen footage of Irma in concert in her early days through her 80th birthday celebration.

At the start of her music career, Irma worked as a waitress and occasionally sang with R&B bandleader Tommy Ridgley. With his help, she landed her first record deal and released the single "Don't Mess With My Man" in 1959. The song reached as high as 22 on the Billboard charts. In 2007, Irma won a Grammy Award for album After the Rain.

Along with Irma Thomas in the film are Quint Davis, Trombone Shorty, Reggie Toussaint and Marcia Ball. The focus of the film is not only on her musical career,






but a life filled with both hardship and triumph. Through the years Irma has performed with renowned musicians including James Taylor, Bonnie Raitt and Paul Simon and her 1964 rendition of "Time Is On My Side" inspired the Rolling Stones.

Celebrating Culture with Charles Marsala

In 2021, WLAE launched the program Celebrating Culture with Charles

Marsala into our line-up of travel programming on Sunday nights.

This weekly program showcases what makes Louisiana unique and explores the history, culture and traditions of the state. Episodes feature topics including: The Battle of New Orleans, Mardi Gras, St. Joseph's Day, Route 66, Gulf of Mexico Coastline, The World War II Museum among others.



WLAE continued the trend started in 2020 of broadcasting and live streaming events due to limited audience participation caused by the pandemic. In October of 2021, the station partnered with Catholic Community Foundation celebrating generosity by bringing together the Catholic community for an evening of fellowship on television and social media platforms.

During the televised event, Archbishop Gregory Aymond and the foundation presented the Saint John Paul II Award. The award, established in 1996, recognizes the generosity and Christian stewardship exhibited by a Catholic layperson(s) of high moral character and exemplary values, who has rendered unselfish volunteer service to the institutions and programs of the Archdiocese of New Orleans.





Since 1946, Patio Planters of the Vieux Carré has been presenting Caroling in Jackson Square, a free community singalong for visitors and locals alike. Complimentary candles and songbooks were provided to attendees upon entry into the Square. Guest singers included Mayor Latoya Cantrell, Lt. Governor Billy Nunguesser and Archbishop Gregory Aymond.

The holiday tradition continued in 2021 with a live audience and virtually on the Sunday before Christmas with a live broadcast on WLAE and streaming on several social media platforms.
