


FORMESEMINARY & THE PATH TO PRIESTHOOD






In 2023, Notre Dame Seminary celebrates its 100th anniversary! In recognition of the importance of strong spiritual formation of Catholic priests throughout the history of New Orleans, the executive producers of Shepherd in the City: John Paul II's Visit to New Orleans, Catholics in the Crescent City: The First 300 Years, Glory Days: The Catholic League of New Orleans and the Gabriel Award-winning films A Legacy of Love: Henriette Delille and the Sisters of the Holy Family and Ordinary People, Extraordinary Gifts: The Road to Sainthood are pleased to commemorate the centennial of the founding of the Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans with their next documentary film.

Formed: Notre Dame Seminary and the Path to Priesthood will bring the Graduate School of Theology's 100-year history to life through rare archival photographs and footage. Some of the many bishops and archbishops, thousands of priests, deacons and lay people who attended or have taught at the seminary, including the Most Reverend Gregory M. Aymond, the city's only native New Orleanian NDS alumnus ever to become Archbishop of New Orleans will explain the most important functions and benefits of the seminary, and reflect on how Notre Dame Seminary has changed their lives and formed them in faith.

Navigating growing pains through the Great Depression, World War II, Korea and Vietnam, the Civil Rights movement, and Vatican II, the Seminary has adapted and changed with the times. We'll experience the excitement of one of the Seminary's highest honors and Archbishop Philip M. Hannan's most treasured memories, when Pope John Paul II visited New Orleans and stayed at the Archbishop's Residence at Notre Dame for two days in 1987.

Most importantly, the film will recount the blessings that the majestic Beaux-Arts style Seminary has brought to the city, the Archdiocese and the Church over the past century, and the expansion of its campus and curriculum, which now includes theology degrees for lay people. The documentary will illustrate how, through the intercession of its Patroness, Our Lady, and the assurance of its motto, Deus Providebit (God will provide), Notre Dame Seminary will continue to thrive in difficult times and serve future generations into the next century and beyond.

Formed: Notre Dame Seminary and the Path to Priesthood will premiere on WLAE-TV (New Orleans Public Television) in September, 2023 to coincide with the opening celebrations of the seminary's centennial.

Their double Emmyaward, Telly & Press Club of New Orleans award-winning film Irma Thomas: The Soul Queen of New Orleans, is currently available to public television stations nationwide via NETA (National Educational Telecommunications Association).

Other highly acclaimed releases include Battlegrounds: The Lost Community of Fazendeville, Fitz! The Life and Political Legacy of Jimmy Fitzmorris, Community Coffee: Cheers to 100 Years and their multi-Emmy Award-winning travel series Go Coast: Louisiana which celebrates Louisiana music, food and culture and runs locally on WLAE and statewide on LPB. Jim and Ron invite you to be a supporting partner in this film commemorating 100 years of history of Notre Dame Seminary.

Producer Janet Gross is an award-winning television journalist, writer and producer. She has spent her career talking to people, learning about them and telling their stories.
