The number of callers to the hotline since the program debuted has doubled. In addition to teaching, Dr. Roy serves the community through his private practice, providing clinical mental health counseling services to the English and Spanish-speaking communities through his work with the New Orleans Family Justice Center, the Hispanic Apostolate and as a mental health contributor for several radio and TV stations. He is a board member of Catholic Charities of New Orleans, and was appointed by the Governor of Louisiana to serve on the LPC Board of Examiners (the state licensing board for licensed professional counselors and licensed marriage and family therapists) for 2018-26, where he currently serves as their chair. He is happily married and is the proud father of a son and daughter.



Co-Host Janet Gross award-winning is an journalist, television producer. and writer spent her She has career talking to people, learning about them and telling their stories. In addition to covering TV news in several states,

she has hosted television and radio talk shows in New Orleans.

Producer Steve Schulkens has built a reputation as an award-winning professional in all facets of the communication industry from television producer, reporter and managing news editor to marketing, advertising and public relations executive.

In early 2020, Steve realized that fear, illness, grief and anxiety were spreading quickly, and coping strategies were needed to help our community navigate the global pandemic. His vision and experience made it possible for *Coping During the Covid Crisis* to premiere in March 2020, and the series was awarded the Press Club of New Orleans' Best Talk Show Award in 2021. In 2022, after the crisis had passed, the show was rebranded as *Coping Today*, and the series celebrated its

100th episode in the Fall of 2023.

Schulkens served as producer of WLAE's double Emmy award-winning concert documentary, *Irma Thomas: Soul Queen of New Orleans*, and our Summer 2024 documentary, *Al Scramuzza: The Crawfish King*, which traces the New Orleans seafood icon's tumultuous life journey from rags to riches, to rock bottom to redemption, and helping others heal from gambling and alcohol addictions. Steve has also won Press Club of New Orleans awards for Best Business News story and Best TV Spot news coverage, and Addy awards for numerous projects, in addition to serving as keynote speaker for the Louisiana Broadcasters Association, and the American Marketing Association.
